

BY-LAWS OF UFO RESEARCH NSW INCORPORATED (UFORNSW)

The Committee of UFO Research NSW Incorporated resolved to pass the following by-laws on the 4 April 2009:

1. The Committee authorises any one or more of the members of the Committee to individually or collectively decline admission to a visitor to UFORNSW's public meetings (such a visitor not being a member of UFORNSW) in the Committee member's or Committee members' absolute discretion.
2. The grounds for exclusion of a visitor from UFORNSW's public meetings shall include, but not be limited to:
 - (a) the contravention of the terms and conditions of entry of any venue at which UFORNSW holds its meetings;
 - (b) the visitor being intoxicated by drink or drugs in the opinion of a Committee member or members;
 - (c) the visitor being improperly dressed in the opinion of a Committee member or members;
 - (d) the apprehension of a Committee member or members that the visitor may disrupt the meeting;
 - (e) the apprehension of a Committee member or members that the visitor may molest or injure a person, or persons, at the meeting;
 - (f) the apprehension of a Committee member or members that the visitor may conduct him or herself inappropriately;
 - (g) the apprehension of a Committee member or members that the visitor may use inappropriate language or express views of an offensive nature to persons attending the meeting; and
 - (h) in the opinion of a Committee member or members it is required for the preservation of good order at the meeting.
3. The Committee may issue an advance notice to an individual not being a member of UFORNSW to the effect that they will not be admitted to a particular UFORNSW public meeting or to UFORNSW public meetings generally, for a period of time or an indefinite period of time.
4. The Committee authorises any one or more of the members of the Committee to eject from UFORNSW's public meetings any visitor (such a visitor not being a member of UFORNSW) in the Committee member's or Committee members' absolute discretion.
5. The grounds for ejecting a visitor from an UFORNSW public meeting shall include, but not be limited to, those grounds set out in clause 2 above.
